Emergency and Evacuation Procedures

Department of Art and Art History (ART) and SCULPTURE Buildings

Call 911 for immediate emergency and severe medical situations.

Call Campus Police **801-585-2677** for department/campus related security/reporting and for emergencies that do not require immediate or trained medical responders.


 Meet all personnel at Emergency Assembly Point, parking lot West of ART, with "ART DEPT" placard, Sandie

Evacuation

Assigned Emergency Response Team Responder should:

- Ensure exits and stairwells are accessible and free from obstructions.
- Instruct staff, faculty, and students to exit using the west doors, meet all personnel at Emergency Assembly Point (parking lot #8 West of ART,)
- Instruct evacuees to use **stairs**, not the elevator, as personnel may become trapped in the elevator.
 - Only instruct the use of the elevator if there is absolutely NO Other
 Option of a safe evacuation.
 - Personnel with disabilities should be instructed to remain stationed just inside stairwells if it is safe to do so.
 - Notify rescue personnel immediately of persons with disabilities and their locations
 - If the elevator is **not** an option, and waiting for rescue personnel is also **not** an option, seek help to get any persons who are not physically able to use the stairs out of harm's way.
- Clear floor of all personnel available to exit.
 - Make sure to check the bathrooms are empty
- Meet all personnel at Emergency Assembly Point, parking lot West of ART, with "ART DEPT" placard

Shelter-in-Place/Secure-in-Place

There are a few different scenarios that could lead to a "Shelter-in-Place" notice including Severe Weather and Chemical/Gas releases and "Secure in Place" with an active incident or event that would be safer to resolve with persons on campus in doors.

Weather Event & Gas/Chemical release

- With this kind of shelter-in-place it is possible that all activities can continue, such as classes and Instruction, and immediate action may not be necessary
- Inform personnel of the situation and encourage them to remain in the building
 - You cannot force anyone to remain, only advise strongly that the University has deemed it unsafe.
- Help coordinate a safe exit when the shelter in place is lifted. The parking lot might be hard to navigate depending on the specific situation.

Active Incident/Event on Campus

Emergency Alert from campus should include the following information:

- What areas are affected
- Any instructions; such as secure in place or evacuate "..." location

If you are unclear about how to proceed with the information given in the alert you can call Campus Security **801-581-2677**

- Be ready with a location/building, an approximation of personnel you have in the building, and any information you think is pertinent.
 - Such as classes/rehearsals in session and if all activity should be stopped immediately.

Securing the Area

Note: If following this procedure puts you in immediate danger do not proceed

- If safe to do so inform personnel of the situation and encourage them to remain in the building
 - You cannot force anyone to remain, only advise strongly that the University has deemed it unsafe.
- If the situation has the potential of danger if there are high noise levels or activities drawing any attention to the building or rooms within the building do what you can to stop any noisy conditions
 - o It may also be appropriate to turn off lights as well
- Lock Doors if able
 - Usually when a Secure-in-Place situation occurs on campus doors with Ucard entry will lock down
- It may be necessary to find a room with no windows that can be locked (and/or barricaded) and encourage personnel to assemble there
 - The restrooms may be a good option
- Once the Secure-in-Place has been lifted do a quick survey of the area to make sure everyone is safe and updated.

Campus Alert System Evacuation Notification

Emergency alert from campus should include the following information:

- What areas are affected
- Any instructions (such as secure in place or evacuate "..." location)

Notification for Prolonged building closure Art and Sculpture buildings:

- Email Students, Faculty and Staff: Sandie Crook
- Post printed evacuation/bldg closure notices on exterior doors: Shawn Porter

Student Injury-Emergency Procedures

- Treat using the First Aid Kit available.
 - Faculty and Staff must ensure that the First Aid Kits are adequately stocked and maintained.
- In the event of a significant (but not major) workplace injury beyond First Aid Capability Students should seek medical attention at the Student Health Center at the Madsen Health Center (By Appointment), or Urgent Care at Sugar House Health Center.

NOTE: Call Campus Police Dispatch (801) 585-2677 or 911 if you are unsure of the student's condition. First responders will assess the situation, provide care and an ambulance ride if necessary. Risk and Insurance management does not recommend taking students to a care facility in your own vehicle.

Major (Life Threatening) workplace injuries

CALL 911

Employees and Students with the following should not seek care at RedMed or Madsen clinic and should go to the nearest emergency room or **call 911**.

- Signs of heart attack, including severe chest pain lasting longer than two minutes
- Signs of stroke, including loss of vision, sudden numbness, weakness, slurred speech or confusion
- Compound fracture (bone protrudes through skin)
- Convulsions, seizures or loss of consciousness
- Deep knife wounds or gunshot wounds
- Heavy, uncontrollable bleeding
- Poisoning
- Pregnancy-related problems
- Serious head, neck or back injury
- Severe abdominal pain
- Severe burns
- Severe chest pain or difficulty breathing
- Suicidal or homicidal feelings
- Temperature of 103° or greater

Employee Workplace Injury-Emergency Procedures

Minor workplace injuries (minor cuts, scrapes, splinters, etc.)

Faculty/Staff

- Treat using the First Aid Kit available.
 - Faculty and Staff must ensure that for all classes and labs, as well as for any independent production and class work taking place, the First Aid Kit is adequately stocked and maintained.

Please Note: Any injury where a student, staff member, or employee (including visiting artist/instructors/directors) seek any sort of medical attention through University Health Services or other medical care provider, or is not a minor workplace injury (as described above) must follow the format below for injury response.

In the event of a significant (but not major) workplace injury beyond First Aid Capability:

Persons on payroll can go to RED MED in the Student Union Building.
 An injury or Illness form will need to be filled out and submitted.

RED MED CLINIC UNION BUILDING

Work-related Injuries and Illnesses: The RedMed clinic provides treatment and case management for work-related injuries and illnesses. Employees who are injured at work should use the clinic as their first point of care unless the injury is life- or limb-threatening or occurs after RedMed Clinic hours, in which case the employee should be taken to the nearest emergency room.

Employees and their supervisors should complete a First Report of Injury form prior to visiting the clinic. For assistance in completing the form, contact the Benefits Department and speak to a Leave of Absence Representative.

RED MED Available Services: The clinic offers a variety of medical services at **no cost** for University employees, including:

- Accidents and falls
- Back pain
- Bleeding and cuts (suture, steri-strips, dermabond, bandage and dressing)
- Breathing difficulties, e.g. mild to moderate asthma (peak flow and nebulizer)
- Broken bones and fractures (minor breaks, e.g., fingers and toes)
- Burns, mild to moderate
- Chemical Exposures
- Colds and allergies
- Cough
- Ear ache
- Exposure to blood-borne pathogens
- Eve irritation and redness
- Fever or flu
- Headache
- influenza, pneumonia, shingles and TDAP immunizations
- Joint pain
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
- Pregnancy screening
- Sinusitis
- Skin rashes and infections
- Sprains and strains
- Staple and suture removal
- Throat soreness (rapid strep, etc.)
- Urinary tract screening and treatment of infections, including urine STI testing

Treatment will be documented in the University of Utah Health medical records system (EPIC), which will enable other University of Utah Health providers to have access to notes about your symptoms, diagnosis, lab results and any medications prescribed.

The RedMed clinic currently only treats University employees (including Academic Health Sciences employees). In the future we hope to expand our space and services so that we can also treat family members.

In addition to RedMed, employees enrolled in the University's Employee Health Care Plan also have no-cost access to the Employee Assistance Program for mental health needs and treatment of substance abuse and other addictions found here.

Location of AEDs Automatic External Defibrillator

NOTE: Early defibrillation is a critical component in treating sudden cardiac arrest. AED is a computerized medical device that, when placed properly on a person's chest, can analyze the heart's rhythm and apply an electrical shock if needed.

Emergency Specific Actions

Poisoning

Call the Utah Poison Control Center 1-800-222-1222

Earthquake

During the quake

- Drop to the ground
- Seek Cover. Get under a desk, table, chair, or go against an inside wall
 - Stay away from glass
- Wait it out

After the quake

- Check for injured persons and assist if able
 - Do Not Move seriously injured persons
- If there is damage to the building begin **Evacuation** procedure.
 - NOTE If the structural damage is significant leave as soon as you are able

Utility Failure

Fire or Hazard Susptected

- Call University Police 801-585-2677
- Leave the Area

Suspecting Natural Gas Leak

- Do Not turn equipment, lights, etc. on or off
- Leave Area
- Contact Facilities 801-581-7221

Electrical Power Outage

- Contact Facilities 801-581-7221
- Follow Area Specific Procedures
 - o Your Emergency Response Team will Assist

Flooding, Plumbing, or Steam Line Failure

- Contact Facilities 801-581-7221
- Leave Area

HVAC System

Contact Facilities 801-581-7221

Fire

Small Fire - Trash can size or smaller

- If fire is verified call 911
- Alert people in the area
- If trained use fire extinguisher
 - Always Maintain an Exit Path
 - o Avoid Smoke or Fumes
 - Never attempt to extinguish the fire on your own; have a buddy

Large Fire

- Alert people in the area
- Activate Fire Alarm pull station
- Close doors to confine
- EVACUATE
 - Your Emergency Response Team will Assist
- Call 911
- **Do not use elevators** (unless it is the *only* option)
- Do not reenter building unless notified by campus police or fire response personnel

Fire Extinguisher

P.A.S.S

- Pull the Pin
- Aim at the base of the fire
- Squeeze the trigger
- Sweep across the floor/base

If a fire extinguisher is used contact EHS for a replacement All fires must be reported to the University Fire Marshall 801-581-6590

Violence on Campus

In an Emergency Call 911

Acts of violence - Any act where weapon or physical aggression is used against a person

Workplace violence - Any behavior, action, or statement made by an individual, or group, directed towards another individual, or group, that is threatening or intimidating and causes any reasonable individual to fear for their safety and/or property.

- Report all suspicious or threatening activity immediately to campus police 801-585-2677
- Be aware of locations of Blue Emergency Phones throughout campus
- Request identification of unknown persons in your area
- Stay Alert
- Utilize Campus Security Escorts if you feel threatened, intimidated, or scared by calling 801-585-2677 <u>SafeRide</u>

Active Shooter/Active Aggressor

Assess your options and then take action:

- Run
 - If possible get out of harm's way
- Hide
 - If you cannot get out, Close and Lock doors wherever possible
- Fight
 - If confronted by the shooter do everything possible not to be a victim
